On the first and second Thursdays of November, the Peak Community Services Foundation held two fundraisers, one in Logansport and one in Winamac. Each fundraiser - called the Dream High Breakfast - spotlighted a travesty that exists in the State of Indiana.

Those of you who attended a breakfast know that in the State of Indiana there are 15,500 people with developmental disabilities who are on waiting lists for services. Each person can be on a list for 10 years or longer. 200 of those individuals live in Cass and Pulaski Counties.
